



2020 Grant Guidelines

We appreciate your time and interest in learning about the Catholic Foundation of Michigan. We strive to make the granting process as open and clear as possible. Our grants address community needs within our three focus areas: Social Outreach, Education/Formation, and Parish Life. If you believe your project may be a fit with our funding priorities, we invite you to submit *an online* Letter of Intent (LOI) so that we can begin working with you to see if our collective priorities align.

Funding Eligibility

Before submitting an online Letter of Intent (LOI), please review the following requirements:

- Nonprofit entities in Michigan that serve communities primarily Michigan
- The mission, values and behaviors in line with Catholic Teachings
- Organization is a U.S. 501(c)(3) with audited financial statements
- Addresses one or more of the grant making priorities (detailed below)

We will not likely consider funding the following:

- Individuals
- Funds designated for endowment funds, deficit financing, capital campaigns, or loans
- Programs operated to benefit for-profit organizations
- Organizations that discriminate based on any federally protected status

How to Apply

After reviewing the Catholic Foundation guidelines, eligibility requirements and funding priorities, you may submit a brief online Letter of Intent (LOI) through the link on our website <https://catholicfoundationmichigan.org/grants/>. This link will provide additional information as well as another link to the online Granting website. There you will set up a logon and complete the Letter of Intent. Once reviewed, you will be contacted by our staff and may be invited to apply for funding. You are welcome to call us to discuss your idea and to ask questions about the grant process. - **Stage One: Letter of Intent**

- Letter of Intent (LOI) will be accepted online by the Catholic Foundation on or before May 22, 2020. Once you have completed the online LOI process, you can expect to hear from us within 30 days. Please understand that while all LOIs will be read, all may not generate an invitation to apply for funding. The Catholic Foundation receives many compelling requests each year and regrettably, we are not able to fund each one.

- **Stage Two: Application**

- Once your Letter of Intent has been reviewed, you may be invited to submit a grant application online, due July 31st. Please know that our staff is here to assist you with the application process, however, all funding decisions are made by the Catholic Foundation Board of Directors at their fall quarterly meeting.

2020 Granting Opportunities

The Catholic Foundation of Michigan is pleased to announce our granting opportunities for 2020. Please review the requirements and priorities outlined and consider how your project or program aligns with the Foundation's grant making goals. Catholic Foundation Impact Grants:

Through the generosity of our faithful community, Impact Grants address needs within the Foundation's three focus areas. Grants will be made in increments \$1,000 and \$5,000.

- **Empowering Social Outreach** - Supports programs that respond to vital social services needs such as food shelter, medicine for the sick, hope for those in despair and vulnerable within our community.
- **Building Vibrant Parish Life** – Provides assistance to parishes and programs that create a strong parish environment.
- **Fostering Catholic Education and Formation** – Grants to faith formation for people of every age. We encourage all stages of educational and spiritual development to enhance vibrant discipleship.

Priority will be given to Impact grant requests that:

- Build on the organization's assets and distinctive attributes through best practices and innovation
- Foster collaboration and coordinator of multiple partners or ministries
- Expand services and outreach while building vibrant communities in line with Catholic values
- Improve, measure and demonstrate results
- Ensure sustainability when funding ends

Church in the City Grants:

Through the generosity of the Archdiocese of Detroit, these grants are awarded to Catholic parishes, schools and other Catholic organizations that propagate the Catholic faith in the cities of Detroit, Hamtramck, and Highland Park. Grants will be made in increments \$1,000 and \$5,000.

Priority will be given to Church in the City grant requests that:

- Foster innovative evangelization programs and projects in line with the 2017 pastoral letter [*Unleash the Gospel*](#).
- Boldly proclaim the Gospel of Jesus and lead souls to a personal encounter with him.

Spirit of Innovation Grants:

Through "Spirit-led grants, Catholic parishes, schools and organizations in the Archdiocese of Detroit will be able to develop, launch and grow new initiatives, ministries and approaches that share the good news with all, forming joyful missionary disciples. The grants will:

- Activate future initiatives to serve beyond the work of individual parishes and their Missionary Strategic plans,
- Inspire disciples to dream and innovate
- Attract national ministries and organizations
- Support innovative and outward focused missionary work in the Archdiocese of Detroit,
- Respond to future inspirations of the Holy Spirit

Priority will be given to requests that:

- Articulate the spirit of the Guideposts outlined in the pastoral letter, *Unleash the Gospel*
- Embrace cooperation and collaboration between multiple partners
- Promote youth, young adult or those marginalized populations in our community.



St. Oscar Romero Grant for Hispanic and Latino Ministries:

Thanks to the generosity of the Holy Trinity Parish, Port Huron, this grant seeks to invest in creative programs that help address the critical issues that are preventing many members of the Latino community from reaching their full potential. A \$1,000.00 grant will be awarded to an organization in the Northeast Region of the Archdiocese of Detroit.

Priority will be given to:

- Applicants who can clearly demonstrate that their work will directly benefit a majority Latino population and employ culturally competent best practices.
- Organizations that are Latino led and embody a mission focused on helping the Latino community
- Catholic Organizations
